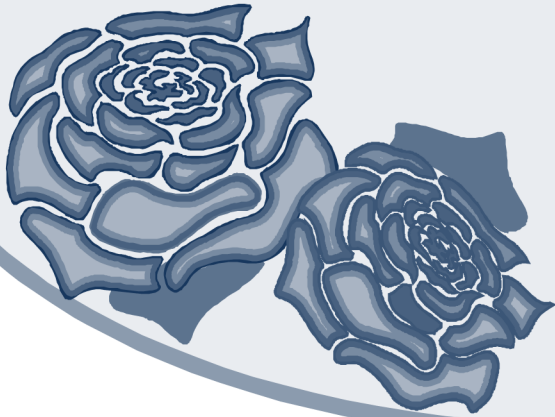
Senior Ministries Baked Goods Sale

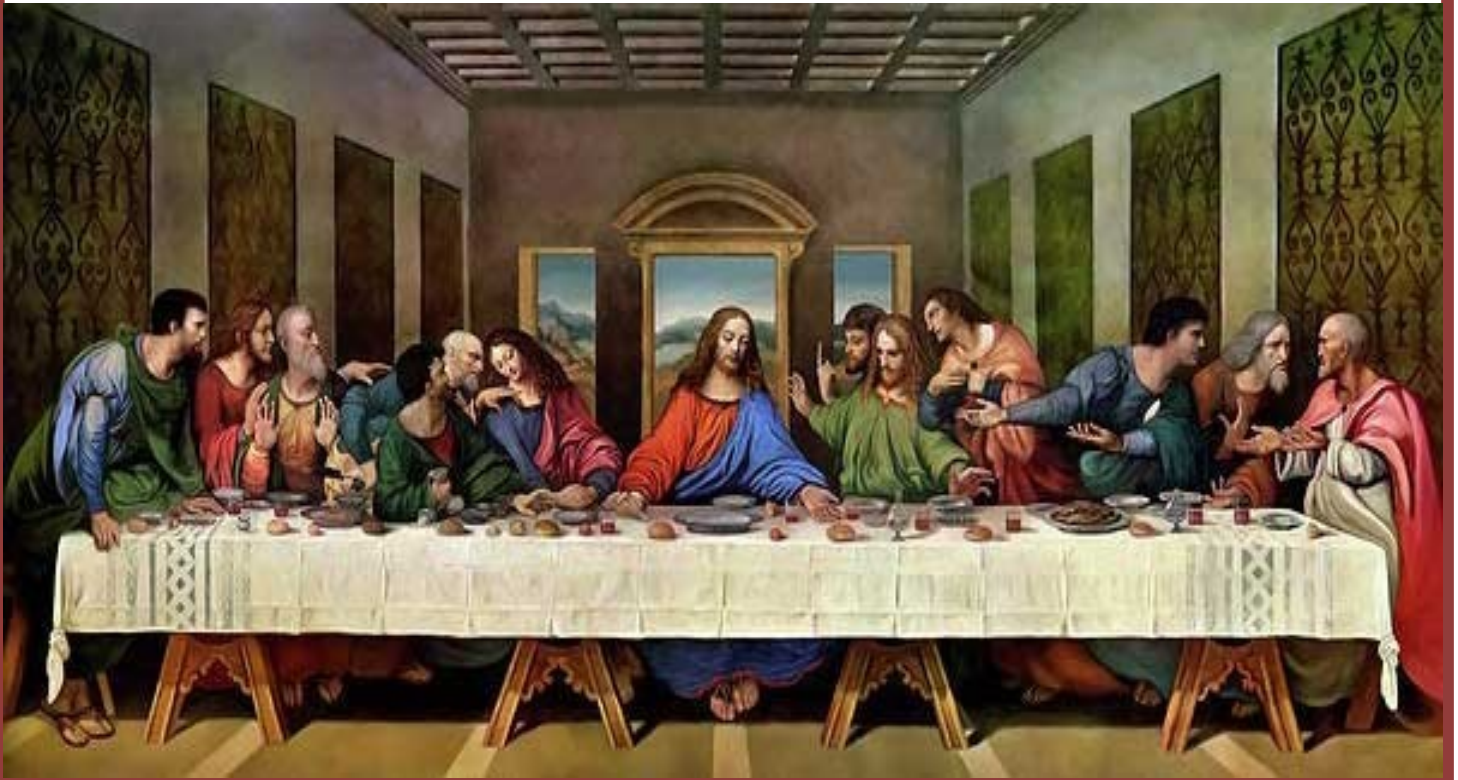
